


## EcotoQ's scientific popularization contests "present your research in ecotox"

## -- Guidelines --

## Video format: 1st price \$400; 2nd price \$200 and 3rd price \$100.

- Videos should be of a maximum of 3 minutes. For example: videos, short films, interviews, songs, clips, presentations under the "3 Minutes Thesis" format...etc.
- You should fill the participation form before March 15th 5 pm.
- Your creation must be uploaded before **March 15th 5 pm** under the MP4 format and in the following configuration: a picture of you in your work environment on one of the backgrounds provided that appears at the screen for 3 to 5 seconds before your video creation (see Figure below).

Note that video files will be too large to be imported directly in the participation form. When filling it, you will be invited to use the portal for large files sharing of INRS (portail de partage de fichiers volumineux de l'INRS). Then you only have to import your file (please use the format first name.last name.mp4) and use EcotoQ student committee email address as recipient: ce.ecotoq@inrs.ca.

## Eligibility criteria:

- Participants to the contest should be supervised or co-supervised by a professor that is a regular member of EcotoQ;



- Participants should be registered to 2nd or 3rd cycle until at least the summer trimester of 2022;
- The research subject must correspond to one the **EcotoQ** research axis;
- The research subject must not be confidential and the participants must have obtained their supervisor's approval to talk about their project for this contest;
- Students that participated in the 2021 edition can participate again, as long as they present an original creation.
